Program Description

This Certificate is designed to provide students with the knowledge and skills necessary to deliver primary and emergency health care as community health aides in rural Alaskan villages under the remote medical supervision of a physician. Students in the program must be employed by a Tribal Health Organization (THO).

APU's CH Certificate—delivering the CHAP Curriculum—covers basic health care information and medical language. It focuses on what community health aides need to know in order to provide effective primary health care, within the limits of community health aide/practitioner protocols. The Certificate consists of four training sessions and a preceptorship. Each of the training sessions includes onsite education at a regional Community Health Aide Training Center, followed by a clinical field component where knowledge and skills are reinforced and evaluated.

Students completing the Certificate can apply for admission in to the AAS in Community Health or any other associate or bachelor's level degree program (check with Admissions or the Registrar's Office for details regarding readmission upon completion from the certificate). Courses completed through the Certificate can apply to associate or bachelor's level requirements.

In addition to those requirements, a candidate for the Community Health Undergraduate Certificate Program must provide documentation of employment showing they are hired as a Community Health Aide by a THO.
