Outstanding Accomplishment of 2013 is...



Jessica McGinty, CHP

Jessica McGinty shows the heart of what it means to be a community health practitioner in rural Alaska. As a health aide for over 6 years and sole provider for most of 2012 Jessica pulled continuous after hours emergency call with only sporadic relief from itinerants. In the past 2 years her community has suffered from multiple unexpected tragic deaths, she provided emergency medical response to all of them.

Despite the many tragedies and limited staffing, Jessica provided extensive help and intervention to a suicidal patient that most certainly could have ended as another tragic death to further compound the anguish amidst her community. She spent hours with this patient talking about getting help, stopping drinking, and explaining that life was worth living. In the end the patient accepted help and Jessica was there to support the patient through receiving care.

Jessica's actions are consistent with her usual giving of her heart and time for her community.

With all her commitment and effort in 2012, Jessica McGinty went above and beyond the tremendous requirements of health aides.
