

"Emerson began his career with Chugachmiut in 2013 as a CHA Trainee. While fully engaged in any project he takes on, Emerson is a family man and puts his family first. When others do not understand how to put something together, when there are IT issues or the generator is not working, it is Emerson who gets called. In December, there was a 5-day power outage. Emerson was on call and for these 5 days, he would go to the clinic every 4-5 hours around the clock to start the generator and let it run for 1-2 hours to keep the vaccine refrigerator at proper temperature. Emerson kept very clear records of refrigerator temperatures and not one vaccine was lost."

There were 10 people on board the plane; it was way off of the road. We had to hike to the scene and backboard 5 of the survivors. 2 walked and 3 did not make it. We had about 40 people from the village to help carry out the injured. Julianna did a very good job."

"For more than 25 years, Irene worked for NSHC, providing for the people of Golovin. She was one of NSHC's "Golden Girls"; one of the longest-serving Health Aides. Before becoming an NSHC employee, she served as a health aide and helped visiting nurses and doctors. According to those who knew her, Irene treated her patients as if they were her own children, like the caring mother she was. Irene was known by many as "Nurse," a nickname that arose from her true background. She received her Licensed Practical Nurse certification at Mt. Edgecumbe in the 1950s. Irene will truly be missed, but her memory lives on in the Golovin clinic that bears her name and in the hearts of those she treated over


the years."
